

Ashish Foundation offers three core programs, each designed to support growth, learning, and inclusion at every stage of life:

**Ashish Centre:** For children aged 3 and above, this program focuses on holistic learning and development. Students build foundational social roles — such as being a learner, a family member, a citizen, and an enthusiast of hobbies and interests.

**Ankur:** Designed for young adults above 18, Ankur focuses on vocational training and customized employment opportunities, helping interns gain practical skills and independence.

**Advay:** This program encompasses workshops and training for parents, professionals, and community members. Advay also raises awareness, promotes sensitization, and builds networks with organizations and institutions to enhance opportunities for people with disabilities.

### **Empowering Inclusion**

Beyond our direct programs, Ashish Foundation partners with organizations, institutions, and communities to promote inclusive practices and foster valued social roles for individuals with disabilities. Through these collaborations, we inspire communities to create opportunities for acceptance, participation, and empowerment.

### **Support Functions**

Our Finance, Administration, Communications, Fundraising, and Human Resources teams ensure smooth and efficient operations, while maintaining full compliance with statutory requirements. Annual accounts are audited by an external auditor, reflecting our commitment to transparency and accountability.

Looking ahead, Ashish Foundation is committed to excellence and transformation:



# Access Creates Change: Aanchal's Story of Confidence



When Aanchal, from Shadipur Transit Camp, joined Ashish Foundation a year ago, she had never attended school, struggled with hygiene, and found social interaction difficult. Growing up in a low - income settlement, she had almost no access to education or therapy, leaving her potential unseen — a challenge faced by many children with developmental disabilities.

With a scholarship and free transport, she accessed education, speech and occupational therapy, and special education. Today, Aanchal is confident, curious, and spirited. She loves music, exploring new things, helping friends, and taking responsibility at home and school. Supported with clear instructions, visual cues, and engaging activities, she thrives, contributes, and blossoms.

Aanchal's journey shows that when barriers are removed and children are supported in valued roles, they grow, shine, and inspire their communities.

# THE POWER OF PROCESS, THE PROMISE OF CHANGE

At Ashish Foundation, 2024-25 has been a year that exemplifies the theme: "The Power of Process, The Promise of Change." Every structured approach, every training, and every initiative has reinforced our mission to transform lives of children, young adults, and individuals with disabilities while fostering inclusive communities.

# **Empowering Through Structured Processes**

Our programs thrive on well - defined processes that prioritize holistic development. Individual Development Plans (IDPs), powered by Ablespace software, enable meticulous monitoring, evaluation, and personalized learning trajectories for each student. Technology integration — from tablets for communication to smart boards in classrooms — has enhanced experiential learning and engagement, ensuring that students gain not only academic knowledge but also real - life skills.

# **Professional Growth and Capacity Building**

This year, our staff undertook numerous professional training programs, strengthening their expertise across

education, therapy, vocational guidance, and organizational management. Our Communications and Fundraising teams were strategically strengthened, enhancing visibility, engagement, and outreach. Staff participation in the India Fundraising Conference (Feb 2025) further enriched our understanding of sustainable fundraising practices, enabling us to expand our programs and community impact.

# **Updating and Expanding Our Digital Presence**

Ashish Foundation made significant strides in enhancing its digital presence with the development of a new website, realized through a pro - bono partnership with NASSCOM Foundation. Over a threemonth project, Adobe employees lent their expertise during the design phase, helping create a modern, user - friendly, and engaging digital platform. Parallelly social media channels were revitalized, with quality content shared consistently to raise visibility, increase awareness, and strengthen engagement with families, donors, and the broader community. These efforts have significantly expanded our digital footprint and amplified our mission online.



### **Futures Planning for Students and Interns**

We implemented the Futures Planning process for students and interns, designed to map out personalized pathways toward their aspirations. By combining individual strengths, interests, and skills with structured guidance and mentorship, this initiative helped each learner envision and plan for a meaningful future. From choosing career options to exploring community roles, Futures Planning has been instrumental in turning dreams into actionable pathways, ensuring that every student and intern has a clear trajectory toward independence, purpose, and societal contribution.

### Parents' Workshop on Respect and Dignity

We organized series of workshops on "Cultivating Respect, Dignity and Choices" for Persons with Disabilities. By guiding parents to embrace these values in their interactions with family members with disabilities, the workshop reinforced how consistent, mindful practices at home can

drive meaningful change in a child's life. It underscored the vital role of families in shaping an environment where students are valued, respected, and empowered, turning understanding into tangible progress for inclusive growth.

### A Year of Growth and Promise

From leveraging technology for communication, implementing structured IDPs, strengthening our staff and professional capacity, to creating immersive experiential learning opportunities for students, 2024–25 demonstrates how consistent processes drive meaningful change. Every activity, training, and collaboration embodies our commitment to ensuring that individuals with disabilities are empowered, included, and celebrated as valued members of society.










### **ASHISH CENTRE**





The year 2024–25 was one of learning, inclusion, and growth at the Ashish Centre. New admissions across classes brought energy and diversity, with detailed assessments and Individual Development Plans (IDPs) ensuring every child received personalized support. Regular academic, social, and pre - employment sessions were complemented by consistent Occupational and Speech Therapy.


Students participated in rich social learning experiences — market visits, cooking

sessions, and outings to parks, museums, and nurseries — building independence and communication. Social learning activities included visits to markets, grocery stores, museums, parks, and cultural sites like Joygaon, Waste to Wonder, and Bal Bhavan, helping students gain practical skills, build confidence, and connect with their community.

Festivals and celebrations — Lohri, Republic Day, Holi, Friendship Day, Raksha Bandhan, Independence Day, Teachers' Day, Diwali, and Christmas — were celebrated inclusively, fostering social engagement and joy. Students participated in special events such as the Vedanta Delhi Half Marathon (VDHM), Monsoon Camp, and inclusive community activities like the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, reinforcing independence, teamwork, and civic responsibility. Birthday celebrations offered students the opportunity to enjoy milestones with peers.

MAPs and PATH sessions helped students articulate goals and aspirations, while Parent Workshops on Dignity of Risk and Respect and Choice deepened family engagement. Parents' get - togethers and quarterly meetings strengthened homeschool collaboration.

## Harshit's Journey: From Vulnerability to Valued Roles



Harshit's early academic journey was challenging. Born neurodivergent, he struggled in school after a long break and was promoted without mastering concepts, leaving his family worried about his independence. Special schools were financially out of reach until they discovered Ashish Foundation.

Harshit thrives with encouragement, clear instructions, respectful communication, and group activities where he feels included. Harshit has moved from vulnerability to valued social roles. He is now recognized, respected, and empowered, gaining confidence, self - worth, and meaningful participation in his family, school, and community.



### **ANKUR**

At Ankur, interns enhanced their vocational skills through structured training in jewellery making, candle and soap production, paper crafts, and sublimation printing. They showcased their creations at exhibitions held at Jaspal Kaur Public School, the Rohini Diwali Mela, and were proudly invited to Transworld Shipping & Logistics, Jasola, Delhi office and Marriott International corporate office, where they not only displayed their products but also promoted awareness about disability inclusion.

Beyond vocational training, interns participated enthusiastically in the Vedanta Half Marathon and Apeejay Mini Marathon. Field visits to markets, offices, and nurseries



The Customized Employment Program (CEP) grew with the addition of a new intern - Aryan. Through discovery visits, job mapping, and collaboration with IDEA (Saksham), the program overall advanced individualized job development. PATH and Customized Planning for Employment sessions helped each intern identify personal aspirations and prepare for meaningful, independent careers.





### **Esha - Growing into Confidence with Valued Roles**



Esha sees the world in vibrant colors — through music, dance, and a flair for style that lights up every room. Born with Intellectual Disability and microcephalus, she faced early challenges — delayed milestones, seizures, and medical issues. When she joined Ashish Centre in 2023, structured guidance helped Esha transform. She now manages daily chores, expresses herself through journaling, music, dance, and creative activities, and learns new skills like making key - chains and bracelets. Academically, she engages with class discussions and is improving in mathematics.

Esha thrives as a caring daughter, supportive sister, and joyful community member. Confident, stylish, and interactive, she takes pride in her individuality. She dreams of becoming a Hindi teacher and exploring the world,

### **ADVAY**

By providing workshops and training to parents, educators, and other stakeholders we empowered them to help individuals with developmental disabilities assume valued social roles. Advay also focuses on raising awareness, fostering acceptance, and building community support for individuals with disabilities.

Ashish organized workshops on SRV, interdependence, and choice - making to foster empathy and confidence among participants. We also facilitated get - togethers and parent - teacher meetings



to build awareness, offer guidance, and strengthen collaboration with families. Sessions focused on Women's Day, interdependence, respect, dignity, human rights, and choice for persons with disabilities. Parents received support in understanding IDPs, MAPs, PATH sessions, and the importance of early intervention, enabling them to actively participate in their child's development and learning journey.

Advay strengthened the Foundation's ability to deliver high - quality, person-centered support.





### **COMMUNITY OUTREACH**

Community engagement remained at the heart of Ashish Foundation's mission. Awareness drives in Shadipur, Goyla Dairy, Najafgarh, Pochhanpur, and Sapera Basti reached hundreds through street plays and interaction, identifying over 15 children for support.

A workshop at Ducklings Bay Play School sensitized parents to early signs of developmental delays, leading to new enrolments. The 'We Care' Fest skit at Apeejay School of Management Institute, inspired college students to build



friendships with persons with disabilities. The joint Swachh Bharat Abhiyan strengthened environmental responsibility and inclusion. Awareness videos on autism and early intervention shared online extended the Foundation's reach and visibility across communities.

Partnerships with organizations like S&P Global, Youthlite, and Youth4Jobs, and participation in the Zero Project Conference and Alliance Building Summit, expanded Ashish Foundation's visibility and collaboration network.





### Sandeep's Story: From Hidden to Honoured



Locked away at home, Sandeep's early life in Shadipur was marked by poverty, health challenges, and societal stigma. Born in 2004 in Punjab, his neurodivergence went unrecognized, early schooling was intermittent, and simple joys like playing and exploration were denied.

In April 2024, Sandeep joined Ashish Foundation. Through individualized support, structured guidance, and hands - on learning, he began discovering his abilities. Teachers and counsellors helped him develop life skills, manage money, and engage confidently with others.

Today, at Ankur Vocational Centre, Sandeep sorts beads, assists in sublimation work, cooks, and handles production tasks. He enjoys making choices about food, clothes, and activities, while supported with clear instructions and boundaries. Known for his sharp mind, friendly nature, love for music and dance, and sense of responsibility, he contributes meaningfully to his family

and community. Once hidden and isolated, Sandeep is now confident, capable, and respected — a testament to how support, dignity, and opportunity can transform lives.














### **Notes on Accounts**

### **Staff Training**

This year saw extensive professional development for the Ashish team. Two staff attended SRV 5.0. There were sessions on inclusive practices, and monitoring & evaluation, alongside peer learning on Al tools and behavioural support.




In - house trainings focused on Ablespace and PSS, while external sessions included a Monitoring & Evaluation webinar by Dhwani Foundation and the Global Summit on Alliance Building. Staff members also attended SRV - based trainings — "Foundations of Inclusive Practices" and "Voice & Choice" by the Keystone Institute, alongside a UDID and Disability Certification webinar to stay informed on government provisions.


Ashish Foundation undertook SERVE Coaching, a pro bono program launched by Quantam Leap company to support social enterprises and NGOs. Through this training, we benefitted across multiple areas, gaining guidance and practical tools in strategic planning, operational efficiency, team building, leadership development, outreach expansion, and sustainable growth.

To strengthen emergency preparedness and ensure a safe environment for students and staff, a Fire Safety workshop and drill was conducted at the Centre. Staff members actively participated in the session, learning about evacuation procedures, use of fire extinguishers, and safety protocols during emergencies.

The year also included workshops on organizational values, a psycho wellbeing session on aligning personal and institutional vision, and a team picnic at Madhavgarh Farm for bonding and rejuvenation.

### **Volunteers & Interns**

We had 4 students from NMIMS Mumbai who completed their 28 - day internship under the We Care wings. 20 MSW students and an assistant professor from the North East Institute of Social Science and Research, Dimapur, Nagaland, visited our center as part of their exposure visit to gain knowledge about autism and developmental disabilities.

36 volunteers from S&P Global Gurgaon and Noida offices visited our centre in two batches and spent a day with students, engaging them in art & craft, indoor - outdoor sports, and cooking activities. They also joined to observe World Down Syndrome Day and undertook a small workshop to understand myths and taboos around disability. 20 volunteers also joined and provided support during Annual Day function.

16 students from Jesus and Mary College, studying B.Sc. Mathematics, did their internship with us. They worked along with programs and communication teams in organizational work and visibility creation.
